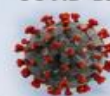

The Heavenly Communication Center

- A great communication center that covers the world.
- God is the Source of the message (The Sender).
- He is perfectly revealed in Jesus Christ (The Mediator).
- He is confirmed by the Word (The Channel/Media).
- He is made alive by the Holy Spirit (The Channel that filters the message).
- He is entrusted to the Church (The Media).
- He is transmitted through preaching, testimony, and the media.
- He reaches the nations (The recipients).
- But now the nations have no excuse for their sin (John 15:22).

The Greatest Communication Breakdown in History

- Imagine a country where all communication towers suddenly fail: no telephone, no Internet, no radio, no television. As a result, all communication is cut off.
- Spiritually, this is exactly what happened to the nation of Israel in Ezekiel 22:30, and it was not the first time such a separation had occurred.
- The greatest spiritual communication breakdown between humanity and God took place in the Garden of Eden, caused by the disobedience of Adam and Eve when they ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. A great breach had occurred.

The Breach: A Broken Communication with Heaven

- “But your iniquities have separated you from your God.” (Isaiah 59:2)
- This breach was not merely in a wall, but in the relationship between God and His people.
- The real wall that was destroyed was their fellowship with God.
- The Hebrew word פֶּרֶץ (Perets) means: crack, opening, rupture, hole, or breach in a wall.
- In ancient times, when a wall was breached:
- The enemy entered,
- The city became vulnerable,
- Peace disappeared.
- Spiritually:
- Sin opens a door to Satan

God Is Looking for a Repairer

- God does not say that He is looking for a king or a president.
- He does not say that He is looking for a famous prophet.
- He says that He is looking for a man.
- Because one man can change the destiny of a nation.
- Moses stood in the breach to intercede for the people of Israel before God.
- “But now, please forgive their sin—but if not, blot me out of Your book.”
(Exodus 32:32)
- Nehemiah saw the walls of Jerusalem destroyed. He wept, then rebuilt them.
(Nehemiah 2–6)
- God said, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?” Isaiah answered, “Here am I. Send me!” (Isaiah 6:8)

Jesus Christ: The True Repairer of the Breach

- “For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus.” (1 Timothy 2:5)
- Ezekiel announces the need; Jesus perfectly fulfills this mission.
- He not only rebuilds a wall, but restores the relationship between God and all humanity.
- The word Mediator is remarkable; He is the personified Media.
- He is the One who restores communication between two separated parties.
- Therefore, the greatest media in the history of humanity is not technology, but a Person—Jesus Christ.
- “I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.” (John 14:6)

The Church Is Called to Continue This Mission

- “As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.” (John 20:21)
- Jesus is the Mediator, but He entrusts His message to His Church.
- Today’s Church becomes:
- The ambassador of the Kingdom,
- The messenger of the Gospel,
- The guardian of the truth who stands in the breach for the nations.

The Nations Connected to Heaven

- “For it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes...”
(Romans 1:16)
- Thus, the nations are connected to heaven not because technology is powerful, but because the Gospel of Jesus Christ is powerful, and because God chooses to use men and women like you—Pastors, Missionaries, Evangelists, Technicians, Journalists, Musicians, Teachers—and means of communication, consecrated media, so that this message may reach the whole world.
- Today, God asks the same question He asked Ezekiel:
- Who will stand in the breach to connect the nations to heaven?

God Is Looking for a Man to Build the Wall

- “I searched for a man among them who would build up the wall and stand before Me in the gap on behalf of the land so I would not destroy it, but I found no one.” (Ezekiel 22:30)
- Jesus fulfilled this perfectly, but He did even more: He not only stood in the breach, He repaired it through His sacrifice.
- “For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus.” (1 Timothy 2:5)
- “All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting people’s sins against them. And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation.” (2 Corinthians 5:18–19)

Imagine a huge wall surrounding a city

- Imagine a huge wall surrounding a city with a breach in the middle.
- The enemy is about to invade the village, but no one dares to step forward.
- Then a Man appears.
- He does not run away.
- He stands in the breach.
- He Himself becomes the barrier between judgment and the people.
- He was rejected.
- He was beaten.
- He was crowned with thorns.
- He was nailed to a cross.
- He was laid in a tomb.
- But on the third day, He rose again, victorious over death, sin, and Satan.

Jesus Christ Is the Only Mediator Between Heaven and Humanity

- Jesus Christ is the only Mediator between heaven and humanity.
- Through His cross, He repaired the greatest breach in history: the one that separated humanity from God.
- “Do not be afraid! I am the First and the Last. I am the Living One. I was dead, and now look, I am alive forever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.” (Revelation 1:18)
- “Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?... But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.” (1 Corinthians 15:55–57)

Jesus Repaired the Breach to Connect the Nations

- Jesus repaired the breach.
- Now He sends His Church to proclaim this Good News to the ends of the earth.
- “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”
- The media do not replace the Savior, our Mediator, Jesus Christ; they become the channels through which the nations can hear the call of the One who stood in the breach for them.
- Thus, Jesus, the perfect Mediator, has connected the nations to heaven

Jesus Repaired the Breach to Connect the Nations

- And now, the One who stood in the breach for you is calling you.
- He invites you to cross the bridge He built between heaven and earth.
- He says:
- “Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.” (Matthew 11:28)
- “Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion.” (Hebrews 3:15)
- My brothers and sisters, The media do not replace the Savior, our Mediator, Lord Jesus Christ; they become the channels through which the nations can hear the call of the One who stood in the breach for them. Do you use the media to bring people closer to God?
